



CHRISTMAS TREE VARIETIES

BALSAM FIR

This is one of the most fragrant of all the cut Christmas trees. It has short dark green needles with a silvery cast that are soft to the touch. Balsam Firs are grown in Eastern Canada. They are long lasting and have a nice symmetrical shape however, they have flexible branches that may not stand up to heavy ornaments.

DOUGLAS FIR

An aristocrat in Christmas trees! The Douglas Fir has fragrant, long flat needles that are soft and pliable and light blue to dark green in colour. They are bushier than the Balsam variety and delightfully aromatic. Douglas Firs are very long lasting.

FRASER FIR

Truly one of the most beautiful of all Christmas trees. Although very dense, Fraser Firs are slightly more open than its sisters with a narrow, pyramid shape making it good for smaller spaces. The strong upward branches are able to support heavier ornaments and the short dark green needles have a blue tinge on the reverse side. They are extremely long lasting with very little needle drop.

NOBLE FIR

A symmetrical tree with good proportions that resembles a blue spruce but with soft needles and a sweet pine fragrance. With its stiff branches with good spacing between the branches it easy to show off ornaments. It has bluish – green needles with silvery white undersides and good needle retention.

NORDMAN FIR

This has been a very popular tree in the UK for years. It has a nice, wide, conical, symmetrical shape. The strong branches are great for heavy ornaments and the soft, shiny, dark green needles have a silvery blue underside. It is very long lasting with excellent needle retention, little to no drop.

SCOTCH PINE

An all-time favorite tree that is grown in Ontario. Scotch Pines have a loose open pyramidal shape and a traditional pine scent. The stiff branches, excellent for holding heavier ornaments, have long, stiff needles with a blue-green colour. The needles hold well, are very long lasting and will not drop even when the tree is dry.

WHITE PINE

Similar in appearance to the Scotch pine, this variety has soft lacy foliage, and is very full looking. The White Pine has very little fragrance therefore triggers less allergic reactions compared to trees with more fragrance. They also have excellent in needle retention.

COLORADO SPRUCE

This tree has a good pyramid shape with strong branches making it a good choice for heavier ornaments. It has silvery blue needle that have good retention, very little needle drop.
